Esther's Bookshelf

NF 972.85 PRE (2017). Lost City of the Monkey God by Douglas Preston. Thrilling, powerful adventure story that is true - a 500-year old legend, an ancient curse, a stunning medical mystery, and a pioneering journey into the unknown heart of the world's densest jungle. In 2012, Douglas Preston climbed aboard a rickety plane carrying the one machine that would change history: lidar, a highly advanced technology that could map the terrain under the densest rain forest canopy. In an unexplored valley ringed by steep mountains, that machine revealed the image of a sprawling metropolis, tantalizing evidence of not just an undiscovered city but an enigmatic lost civilization. In the photo section of the book, one also gets to see the fer-de-lance, one of the world's deadliest snakes, most aggressive, and six feet long with a body thickness of a man's forearm.

In the 80's when I was on a three-week mission trip to Belize in Central America, we took a day off to visit the Mayan ruins and were warned about this deadly snake. It was described as lime green, small like the coral snake and highly venomous. Having a heightened fear of any snakes, I was barely cognizant of my surroundings, so alert I was to spot one before it found me! We had hiked for an hour through what seemed impenetrable jungle, and by the time we arrived at the ruins, I practically stood still in the middle, not enjoying a romp over the ruins or exploring to any extent, so anxious I was about being attacked by this ferocious and aggressive creature! Normally I love to hike and explore and had highly anticipated being in a different world. However, had I ever seen this fer-de-lance as described in the book, I might have dropped dead from fear and shock and never left the jungle! Guess they grow bigger in an ancient uncivilized rain forest!

F (2017). The Daughter of Sherlock Holmes by Leonard Goldberg. This is for those lovers of Sherlock Holmes' sleuthing skills - once again the game's afoot! A delightful new mystery caper involving the usual evil adversaries, discovery of a hidden treasure, and events spanning the Second Afghan War of 1878-1880. An ingenious plan must be acquired to dodge Scotland yard and the British aristocracy, avoid being murdered and catch a murderer in the act. However, this is the year 1916, Sherlock Holmes is now dead, and no one can ask him to solve this mysterious tale that arrives at 221b Baker Street. Yet Holmes and Watson are once more reunited in those dark streets of London (that is, Sherlock Holmes' brilliant and beautiful daughter and handsome, charming Dr. John Watson, Jr.) You may well ask how there can be a daughter of this cold, unemotional, although intriguing, famous detective whose only passion is for the usefulness of his keen deductive steel-trap mind . . . Happy reading and a discovery for yourself.




